Art, History, Culture, and the Sciences

Udacity

This free e-learning course provides an introduction to iOS App Development with Swift. In this course you will build an iPhone app that records a conversation between you and a friend, and then makes your voices sound like a Chipmunk or Darth Vader.

- Introduction to iOS app development in Swift, a new programming language from Apple, and serves as your launching point into the iOS Developer Nanodegree.
- This course assumes prior programming experience. Specifically, you should have a strong understanding of programming concepts like variables, if statements, loops, functions, and classes. Lesson 1 of Intro to Computer Science and Programming Foundations with Python are good courses to take if you are completely new to programming. You will also need access to a Mac computer running OS X 10.10 or later.
- On this course you will learn:
 - Lesson 1: An introduction to Swift and Xcode; the tools of iOS.
 - Lesson 2: iOS app structure; AutoLayout and Buttons.
 - Lesson 3: Using ViewControllers to build an app with Multiple Views.
 - Lesson 4: How to record audio and use the Delegation Design Pattern.
 - Lesson 5: Playback sound and add sound effects.

- Courses are delivered by native speakers.

- You can access it on the web, or by downloading a free app on your smartphone.
- Duolingo offers a number of short interactive quizzes and games, which take a few minutes to complete at a time.
- If you download the app then it will remind you when it's time to learn – so that you at least get five minutes of practice time each day.
- Whilst you can use Duolingo completely free, you can sign up to a premium subscription if you would prefer to have an ad-free experience and be able to access content whilst offline.

Social Care

Dementia Awareness

This course from SCIE (Social Care Institute for Excellence) seeks to improve the wellbeing and experience of people with dementia and of the care staff working with them.

- It aligns with Tier 1 of the National Dementia Training Standards Framework, which is a requirement for all staff working in social care. It will also allow you to collect evidence towards the relevant section of the Care Certificate.
- This course is for all staff who work with people living with dementia, including care assistants, carers, day care assistants, support workers, nursing assistants, volunteers.
- This course is free to use for non-commercial and educational purposes, no certificate is available.

Personalisation: Introduction

This course from SCIE (Social Care Institute for Excellence) is aimed at social care professionals and people receiving social care support.

 - what personalisation means and why it's important,
 - where the ideas behind personalisation come from,
 - how people are putting the ideas behind personalisation into practice,
 - what a personalised care and support system looks like and what it can offer people,
 - and how you can be a part of making personalisation happen.
- This course is free to use for non-commercial and educational purposes, no certificate is available.

- It is aimed at all social care professionals and those receiving social care support.

Self-Harm and Risky Behaviour

Suicide Prevention

Developed for the wider public health workforce, 'We need to talk about suicide: helping everyone to feel more confident to talk about suicide' is an e-learning programme for the voluntary sector, blue light services, prison staff and prison listeners health and social care.

- It was developed by a range of experts including experts by experience i.e. those people who have attempted to take their own lives and those bereaved and affected by suicide.
- The learning is specifically aimed at making sure that everyone in contact with the public, in whatever role, knows how to spot any signs of mental distress and feel comfortable in talking about suicide.
- Talking about suicide can be used as a normal part of all our interactions at home, in the workplace and in the wider community.

There is no need to register. You can access the course, which takes approximately 60-90 minutes, by going to: www.nwyhelearning.nhs.uk/elearning/HEE/SuicidePrevention/.

Quality Improvement in Health and Social Care

This course from SCIE (Social Care Institute for Excellence) helps you learn about the process of quality improvement and how to implement it in social care services.

- This online learning resource supports managers and staff working in health and social care to be more knowledgeable about – and understand – the process of using and implementing quality improvement methodology.
- There are two main sections within this resource:
 - A core learning pathway which describes the steps to implement quality improvement using the model for improvement.

- A number of case studies – both individual and organisational – which illustrate how quality improvement has been implemented and measured.
- This course is free to use for non-commercial and educational purposes, no certificate is available.

Various (Eligibility Criteria Applies)

This section includes courses which require that you meet certain eligibility criteria to access them such as age, receiving benefits or not being in employment, education or training. Each course includes details on their specific eligibility criteria.

There is a separate section called 'Various (Free for Everyone)' where you don't need to meet eligibility criteria to access them.

Standguide

If you're working or unemployed, furloughed or looking for something positive to do with around 5 hours a week of your time, then "Time to Learn" distance learning courses from Standguide could be for you.

- Learners can choose one of three pathways, or combine elements of all three, so that your learning programmes is bespoke to your individual needs. These include:
 - *Time to Upskill*: includes courses to improve your literacy, numeracy or digital skills.
 - *Time to get Work Ready*: learn skills to help you find employment or progress within your existing job.
 - *Time to Qualify*: get a nationally recognised qualification online, such as Level 2 Certificate in Customer Service or Level 2 Certificate in Creating a Business Start-up.
- You need to be a Greater Manchester resident.
- You will need to call Standguide's referral phone line to register your interest, following which they will call you to discuss your needs and build a programme for you. You will be allocated a tutor and have regular reviews. Programmes are flexible to your circumstances.

Maximus Training

Fully funded training courses to eligible residents of Greater Manchester aged over 19 years old and not in education, training or employment.

- Learners will need proof of ID, address and benefit verification to start a programme.
- Available courses include:
 - *ESOL*: This course will provide the learner with the essential language skills that you will need to be able to properly communicate in English. Covering areas such as grammar and punctuation, writing and reading, and speaking and listening. They will develop a better understanding of the English language.
 - *English/Maths (Functional Skills)*: Functional Skills qualifications are designed to enable students to develop confidence and fluency in Maths and English. They equip learners with the practical skills to get the most out of education, work and everyday life and to help them function more confidently, effectively and independently. Wellbeing and Employability: The course designed to give learners practical knowledge in employability with a focus on personal health and wellbeing. This course allows them to become more confident in not just their own employability, but also provides the tools to better manage their own wellbeing and ability to progress into employment.
 - *Customer Service*: The Awards/Certificates for Introduction to Customer Service qualifications cover the basic elements of how to deliver an excellence customer experience, ranging from answering the telephone to applying legislation. The course will suit the learner if they are looking to work in the customer service industry but currently have no knowledge and experience. At this level they will develop their customer service knowledge.

Skills People Group

You will need a computer/laptop or tablet to access the courses, internet access and ID documents to prove your eligibility.

- Eligibility criteria: Age 19+. Unemployed and not in full-time education. British/EU citizen or UK resident for 3 years or more.
